1.	Locate Kwame Alexander's birthplace on a world map. Research 10 facts about this location—Geography		
2.	Create a symmetrical, geometrical pattern using squared paper and a mirror—Maths		
3.	Research and present information about an American civil rights activist (Martin Luther King, Rosa Parks, Muhammad Ali, etc.) - History		
4.	Create a diagram of the lifecycle of a plant which is native to the British Isles—Science		
5.	Write a rap or free verse poem about an issue which you feel strongly about—English		
6.	Find the river Ganges on an atlas. Research why the river is important to the Hindu religion—R.E		
7.	Research examples of Ancient Egyptian art and create your own example using materials of your own choice—Art		
8.	Use 2calculate to create a spreadsheet which shows the total money spent on your last supermarket trip. Save in the Teak 5 folder on Purple Mash—Computing		
9.	Create a timeline of the Civil Rights movement in America—History		
10.	Research somebody famous who has had to overcome prejudices or discrimination within their profession or sport.. (EG Jesse Owens) - PSHE		
11.	Create a fact file or storyboard which shows how ancient Egyptian mummies were made. You could even act this out and photograph each stage! - History		
12.	Showcase something that you have learnt in science this term. You could make a model, record a documentary, ask your own science question and conduct an experiment or show your knowledge any other way you can think of.		
13.	Practise shooting basketball hoops—Can you score more than 5 hoops out of 20 shots? - P.E		
14.	Create a piece of artwork using only materials/ objects that can be found outside—Art		
15.	Try eating or cooking with a range of traditional Egyptian foods—Eg: Falafel, dates, flatbreads and olives. Describe their tastes and tell us what you thought! - Design and Technology		
16.	Take a walk outside and see if you can spot examples of the symmetry, patterns or sequences in nature. Take photographs and send them in using eschools—Maths		
17.	Listen to three pieces of music by Black American musicians from different decades, (EG: 1960s, 1980s and 1990s). Choose your favourite and explain why you liked it—Music		
18.	Watch one of your favourite films with French subtitles. Make a list of any words or phrases that you recognise and write their English meanings. Bring this in to school to share— French		
19.	Research and present information about the River Nile. Present your information to your family or class, or record your presentation—Geography
