

Curriculum Information

Spring 2 EYFS





Our topic this half term is Dinosaur Stomp.

Within this theme, the children will travel by text and the brilliance of their imaginations back in time to find out all about dinosaurs large and small. They will also find out about how and why people celebrate Easter.

As writers, children will be encouraged to compose captions and sentences with an emphasis on phoneme choice and letter formation. Our key texts will include 'Mad about Dinosaurs', 'My Beautiful Voice' and 'The Little Red Hen'.

As readers, we will be entering the land of poetry by working with the book 'Mad About Dinosaurs'. This book will inspire the children to enjoy poetry and learn interesting facts about dinosaurs. Our talk for writing journey continues with the traditional tale 'The Little Red Hen', which will see the children using their story telling skills to support their reading journey.

In Maths, children will continue their learning on number bonds up to 5 and learn number bonds to 10. They will start to identify doubles and halves and will explore and describe 2D and 3D shapes and repeated patterns.

In Science, the children will make predictions based on what they already know. We will look at the classification of dinosaurs and if they are carnivores or herbivores and what that means. In addition, we will find out about Spring and make observations about the seasonal changes that occur. We will look at the lifecycle of a chick, observing how they hatch, change and grow.

In Computing, we will be sequencing pictures to plant seeds, knowing that algorithms can be broken down into steps. In online safety, we will discuss and learn rules to stay safe when using technology and what to do in unsafe situations.

In Design and Technology, we will be making our own Dinoscape, focussing on creating structures using joining techniques and adding papier-mâché.

In Art and Design, the children will create a piece of art work in the style of Van Gogh by painting real life sunflowers, focusing on mixing paint.

In History, we will talk about the past and how dinosaurs are extinct.

In Geography, we will follow a map to walk to a local post box to post a letter.

In Music, we will be learning to sing the 'Five Fine Bumble Bees' song using call and response. The children will also learn that pieces of music and instruments can represent different animals and recognise when the tempo of music changes.

In PSHE, we will recap their learning about road safety through our weekly Warwick Bear discussions. Children will learn about staying healthy and the importance of sleep.

In PE, we will take part in athletic sessions and Forest School.

In RE, children will explore the Christian celebration of Easter, focussing on the importance of Jesus Christ and Christian symbols.
