Academic Year 2024/25

This report outlines how our school has planned to spend the Sports Premium allocation in 2024-25. It also outlines our key principles and reasons for spending the Sports Premium in the way that we do.

Our Principles and Objectives

The Sports Premium is used to fund maintain the standards of additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-ages pupils, in the 2024 to 2025 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

School are free to spend the Sports Premium as they see fit, however our approach and vision for our pupils is to ensure that all are offered '**rich opportunities and memorable experiences**' and that those from poorer socio-economic backgrounds do not suffer barriers which hamper their progress and attainment.

Our decisions on how best to use the 'Sports Premium' are based on the findings of high-quality research and publications, as well as OFSTED's own 'best practice' guides. These have supported our decision on expenditure over the best and most effective use of our Sport Premium Funding.

We believe that:

- All of our children should and will benefit from the teaching and learning opportunities that Sport Premium funding provides
- Appropriate provision is made for all pupils belonging to vulnerable groups, including those who are from socially and economically disadvantaged groups.
- Sport premium spending should be allocated following a needs analysis which identifies children with priority needs.
- Our Sport Premium funding should be spent in a wide and imaginative variety of ways, so as to benefit the wide variety of interests and needs of our children
- Our Sports Premium funding should be spent according to 'best value principles' and related to activities which research suggests will make the very best use of the finances available
- Whilst there are some 'quick wins', there is a need to also take a 'long term view' to stop achievement gaps from widening. Some of our long-term objectives will take more than an academic year to come to fruition.

NB: Whilst many of our highly focussed short term initiatives have shown good success, a number of our initiatives are designed to be 'cumulative in their impact' i.e. we will show significant success over time and across many aspects of the child's life.

Current Impact Statement – 2024-2025

Updated on a termly basis

To maintain the increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

'Subject In Focus' to taken place in January 2025.

Shallow dive by Ofsted completed in April 2025.

Subject in focus and shallow dive showed that skills are taught explicitly and children can apply these skills, teachers are making links to prior learning therefore children are remembering this prior learning, there is well-timed recapping on prior learning and children are active for a large proportion of the lesson.

Subject in focus showed that warm ups continue to revisit skills taught in other areas of PE – for example: using space, using different ways of travelling and following rules of a game, as a warm up in dance.

Key vocabulary is consistently taught explicitly and children are able to discuss what the words mean. Children are able to discuss their prior learning including being able to talk about, demonstrate and explain key vocabulary.

When team teaching with The Aston Villa Coach is taking place, staff are continuing to develop their knowledge and skills and this is evident in future lessons.

Skills are taught explicitly and children can apply these skills.

There is well-timed recapping on prior learning, therefore children are remembering this prior learning.

Children are active for a large proportion of the lesson.

To maintain the broad experience of a range of sports and physical activities offered to all pupils. To maintain the increase participation in competitive sport.

Autumn Term –

- *Sporting competitions/achievements shared in assembly, on Twitter, in the Birchwood Bugle and on the PE noticeboard to celebrate children's achievements.*
- *Participation trophy awarded for last 2 years - competition participation shared with children in assemblies.*
- *Liaised and worked alongside SENDCo to collect data on the amount of Pupil Premium children participating in afterschool clubs and competitions. Arranging a meeting to discuss the outcomes and targets going forward.*
- *Audit of PE equipment and order placed and received on equipment that was needed.*
- *Birchwood have participated in many competitions during the Autumn Term. These include; 6 a-side football – Acton Shield football tournament, indoor girls football tournament – Warton shield, 3 NWPSSA cross country races, Sportshall Athletics, dodgeball competition and 2 hockey tournaments. These events are then put into the Birchwood Bugle/on the website to promote participation and celebrate achievement.*
- *Birchwood have participated in many competitions during the Spring Term. These include; cross country, infant agility, indoor cricket, indoor girls' football, dodgeball and Year 3/4 football. These events were put into the Birchwood Bugle/on the website to promote participation and celebrate achievement.*
- *Birchwood have participated in many competitions during the Summer Term. These include; football, netball, tag rugby, tennis, Year 1/2 cross country, OAA, cricket, Quad kids and rounders. These events are then put into the Birchwood Bugle/on the website to promote participation and celebrate achievement. Over the year we entered 42 different sports competitions, with 189 children taking part in multiple events.*

Continue to raise the attainment in primary school swimming and water safety.

- *Swimming report: Summer 2025: Within our current Year 5 cohort of 68 children, 69% can swim at least 25 metres and 60% have basic survival skills, including being able to float, trend water, roll from their front to their back and to enter and exit the pool safely without using the steps.*
- *Swimming report: Summer 2024: After top up swimming lessons, all children that attended gained in confidence. Within our current Year 6 cohort of 68 children, 93% can swim at least 25 metres and 72% have basic survival skills, including being able to float, trend water, roll from their front to their back and to enter and exit the pool safely without using the steps.*
- *Swimming report: 2023: Within our current Year 6 cohort of 68 children, 88% can swim at least 25 metres and 71% have basic survival skills, including being able to float, trend water, roll from their front to their back and to enter and exit the pool safely without using the steps.*
- *Within our current Year 5 cohort of 68 children, 63% can swim at least 25 metres and 57% have basic survival skills, including being able to float, trend water, roll from their front to their back and to enter and exit the pool safely without using the steps.*
- *Swimming report 2022: Within our current Year 6 cohort of 68 children, 83% can swim at least 25 metres and 85% have basic survival skills, including being able to float, trend water, roll from their front to their back and to enter and exit the pool safely without using the steps.*
