The Challenge:

Calling all budding Geographers!

The Birchwood House Captains are thrilled to announce an exciting geography competition this Spring, where you will have the chance to design your very own island!

The rules:

On the reverse side of this letter, you will find a sheet for you to draw your island and describe it. Alternatively, you may choose to create your own 3D design or an ICT-produced island. Your island should include: a name, a description of the climate, a flag, its location in the world, a currency, and considerations regarding its physical and human geographical features. Your island may also feature special landmarks or even a volcano!

Please return your completed islands to your class teacher by Wednesday, 7th May. They will pass them on to your House Captain for judging!

All entries in the competition will receive one house point, which will be awarded by your teacher and added to the house score. The house with the most entries will also receive a bonus of 10 points, while second place will receive a bonus of 5 points, and third place will receive a bonus of 3 points.

Our House Captains will also select a KS1 and a KS2 winner from their own house, who will receive a special prize for their entry! Entries will also be submitted to the CAT (Community Academy Trust) competition, where submissions will be judged against those of other pupils in the CAT. Prizes will be awarded to the 1st place winners from each Key Stage.


